

KYLEE FLYNN

Starting in soccer at the young age of four, Kylee Flynn has achieved many levels of success as a player and now as a coach. Currently the head coach of the women's soccer program at Monmouth University, we welcome Kylee Flynn into the Mercer County Soccer Hall of Fame.

Coming from a youth program in Langhorne, Pa, Kylee, as an underage member of the Langhorne Strikers travel team, won state titles from U12 through U15, also adding regional titles at U13 and U14. Moving to her true age group, she continued her winning ways with the Strikers again winning multiple state championships. She also entered the Pennsylvania ODP program at the age of ten, progressing to the regional program that saw her play in Ireland and in England as a member of the US U21 team.

Midway through her freshman year of high school, Kylee's mom Judy took a position at the Pennington School, where the family moved to and Kylee's athletic career blossomed as a four sport star, earning Prep B titles in softball, basketball, lacrosse and soccer. It was on the soccer field where Kylee's star continued to rise, scoring 98 goals and assisting on 64 for her stellar career for the Red Raiders. A 2004 NSCAA/ adidas Youth and Parade Magazine All-American and a two-time New Jersey Prep School Player of the Year (2003, 2004), she was a multiple-time selection to both the N.J. Prep All-State and N.J. High School Coaches Association All-State teams and was an Associated Press N.J. All-State Second Team choice in 2002.

Kylee headed south to the University of Tennessee where she proceeded to rewrite the Lady Volunteer's record book. A three time All SEC 1st team honoree, recipient of

All-South, All-Region and All-American recognition during her time with the program, and despite her senior season being cut short due to injury, Rossi finished her career as Tennessee's all-time leader in goals scored (43), game-winning goals (15) and total points (102). She was also the only Lady Vol ever to lead the squad in scoring during all four years of her playing career.

Moving to the sidelines after college, Kylee spent two seasons as an assistant coach under HOF coaches Joe Russo and Bob Turner at the College of New Jersey, At TCNJ, Flynn helped guide the Lady Lions to a combined 31-7-3 overall record and a pair of NCAA Tournament appearances. In 2012 she joined another HOF coach in Krissy Turner at Monmouth University as her an assistant coach. She has been a key part of Monmouth women's soccer's run of success across the last decade, with the Hawks posting a 74-6-6 league record in the last nine seasons. Monmouth won the regular season title in eight of its nine seasons in the MAAC, and converted six of those into NCAA Tournament berths with tournament titles. In that time, Monmouth has recorded a whopping 88 shutouts and piled up 123 total victories. She was named the fourth head women's soccer coach in school history in July of 2022.

With an impressive soccer resume' that continues to grow, and for her past triumphs on the field, we are honored to induce Kylee Flynn into the Mercer County Soccer Hall of Fame.
